We are adding Feliway to the visiting rooms for the Cats.

Feliway is a spray that mimics the natural feline reassuring messages. Feliway helps cats happily adjust, while preventing or

reducing urine spraying, scratching, or hiding. This is extremely helpful for our cats, as multiple cats could be utilizing our visiting rooms throughout the week.

In the York County SPCA, the lobby is the hub for a lot of traffic in the building. You will see people completing adoptions, surrendering animals, passing animals to the vet wing, and so much more. With all of this commotion there are a few things to keep in mind.

- 1. Not all animals do well with attention. Refrain from petting or crowding animals that you do not know.
- 2. The CSR's have a huge responsibility of fielding our public communication, including adoptions, surrenders, lost animals, and so much more. If they are on the phone or working with someone, please allow them to take care of the public first. They will be with you as soon as possible.
- 3. While we are closed to the public, please do not open the front door to let anyone inside. The front desk will screen everyone to determine if they are allowed to be in the building.
- 4. For your safety, do not accept or go near animals that are being brought in by the public.

We appreciate your help with all these pieces, as we could not do all that we do without our volunteers.
