

Animals are typically categorized as unavailable for adoption for the following reasons:

- They are new to the shelter and undergoing medical procedures, health evaluations, behavioral evaluations, or need some time to decompress.
- They are undergoing a mandatory hold
- They are a SafePet animal seeking refuge in our shelter
- They are protective custody animal due to the result of an animal cruelty investigation. These dogs are technically not our dogs to adopt out. We are going through the legal system to have the current owner or the court to sign the pet over to us.
- They are pending adoption
- They are too young for adoption

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

If you are looking for more ways to be involved at the York County SPCA, I will continue to share different opportunities that become available.

Clinic-

- **Registration (Wednesday 7am-9am):**
The clinic is looking for volunteers who would be interested in helping in the morning for the registration process.
- **End of the Day Help (Tuesday or Thursday 2pm-4pm):**
The clinic is looking for volunteers who can help with clean up and check-out at the end of the day. This will include scrubbing surgical instruments, bringing laundry to the laundry room, and cleaning the areas. You may also be helping with bringing animals out to their owners.


Satellite Sites-

ADOPTION STORY: ELVIRA



We received an adoption update about Elvira, now named Gertrude.

From the adopter:

Yes we did change her name! Due to her grandma spirit, we have named her Gertrude and call her Gertie :) She has adjusted well to her new home and she seems to love me and Jared without any issues! She gives us snuggles when we hold her and lets us pet her all the time, and she lets us know when she is done being pet. She also loves being brushed! Gertie has taken over my office as her Queen's Throne as she is now the matriarch of the house and she loves being in our bedroom on the bed. She also likes laying in the windows! She also enjoys taking a morning and evening stroll around the apartment, much like a spry grandma in a walking club might enjoy :D

She is still adjusting to the other kitties. We kept them separate for a few days until she felt comfortable enough here to potty multiple times and eat and drink, which didn't take long. We now leave the doors to her area and the rest of the apartment open when we are home to supervise. Your boys have no issues with her, in fact Jeffy (previously Slug) just wants to eat her food, so he goes innocently toward her and can't tell that she's right there, so she will hiss and Kung Fu punch him and then run away. He doesn't seem deterred as he will go straight for the food again :) Arnie (previously Franko) hissed the first day but now he just watches her and tries to get close to smell her. He's smart though and gives her space until she's ready. They're good boys. Our other black cat is still uneasy, but she doesn't seem too bothered until Gertie gets her feathers ruffled. HOW TO ADOPT A PET

How do you adopt a pet from the York County SPCA?

1. Go to ycspca.org/adopt.
2. Click on Available Dogs, Available Cats, or Other Available Animals to see every adoptable animal by species.
3. Click on an animal's picture to learn more about their personality, estimated age, breed, likes/dislikes, temperament, and needs from their profile.
4. Submit an adoption application by clicking the "Apply for Adoption" button on the animal's profile.
5. Our staff will review your application. This process can take 2- 3 days. We will contact you to let you know your application has been approved or to ask any follow-up questions.
6. Once your application is approved, we will schedule an appointment for you to come meet the animal.
7. If the meet goes well, we'll start your adoption paperwork! Some animals may be ready to go home with you that day, and some might need their spay/neuter surgery or up-to- date veterinary exam before being ready to go home.
8. If the meet does not go well, that's okay! Our adoption counselors will work with you to find a pet who will be your perfect match.



Please keep in mind that we often receive multiple applications for one animal - particularly puppies, kittens, small dogs, and highly sought-after breeds such as Labrador Retrievers. When that happens, we list applicants in the chronological order in which they applied, meaning the first applicant is the first to be considered for adoption, second applicant is the second considered, and so on.

Again, thank you so much for wanting to open your heart to a new companion. Thank you for supporting the YCSPCA during these times and for your understanding.
