Animals are typically categorized as unavailable for adoption for the following reasons:

- They are new to the shelter and undergoing medical procedures, health evaluations, behavioral evaluations, or need some time to decompress.
- They are undergoing a mandatory hold
- They are a SafePet animal seeking refuge in our shelter
- They are protective custody animal cruelty investigation. These dogs are technically not our dogs to adopt out.
 We are going through the legal system to have the current owner or the court to sign the pet over to us.
- They are pending adoption.
- They are too young for adoption.

FEELING HOT! HOT! HOT!

It is that time of year where we are experiencing high temperatures and the heat can quickly become an issue for both humans and animals. We wanted to remind you of some ways to stay cool and safe here at the shelter.

Water Coolers - There are water coolers located in the shelter gift shop at the front lobby and in the clinic. We encourage everyone to use refillable water bottles and things of that sort so you can keep filling them throughout the day. There are plastic cups available if needed.

Water Fridge - There are often drinks available for volunteers in the laundry room. Also, there is a fridge filled with water bottles also located in the shelter gift shop. Keep in mind these cost \$1.

Breaks - Take frequent breaks when handling animals outside, whether it be walking them or doing a meet. Make sure to utilize shaded areas on the property such as the bench near the brick sidewalk, the gazebo, the gravel runs, or really anywhere you can find that may give you a break from the sun.

Be Aware - Take care of yourself! If you are feeling too hot; stop and cool down. If you need assistance in getting water or other resources, reach out to coworkers or a manager. Do not push it.

Your safety and wellbeing is of the utmost importance to us, and we cannot help the animals if we do not take care of ourselves as well!

CLINIC

The clinic is looking for help during the following times. We do ask the volunteers helping in the clinic commit to a weekly shift.

Registration (Tues and/or Thurs 7am-9am):

Help in the morning with the registration process.

End of the Day Help (Mon, Tues, and/or Wednesday 2pm-4pm):

Help at the end of the day with cleaning surgical equipment, laundry, cleaning cages, and other operational tasks as needed.

DOG WALKING

Volunteers are needed to walk all of the dogs in our kennel each day. Walking provides the dog with the exercise, socialization, and outdoor time that they need. A dog walker's commitment to and impact on our animals well-being is invaluable. This is a strenuous, but necessary, role.

KENNEL GREETING
