DOG WALKING REMINDERS

Please make sure to **clean the trail up after the dogs**. There has been a significant increase of dog feces left on the trail. This is unsafe for our animals.

Tick Season has commenced. Within the past week, multiple ticks have been found on animals, volunteers, and staff. Please be mindful of this and make sure to check yourself for ticks at the end of the day.

As it becomes warmer out, please **take care of yourself**. Drink water, take breaks, and wear sunscreen. The dogs need you happy and healthy!

Animals are typically categorized as unavailable for adoption for the following reasons:

- They are new to the shelter and undergoing medical procedures, health evaluations, behavioral evaluations, or need some time to decompress.
- They are undergoing a mandatory hold
- They are a SafePet animal seeking refuge in our shelter
- They are protective custody animal cruelty investigation. These dogs are technically not our dogs to adopt out. We are going through the legal system to have the current owner or the court to sign the pet over to us.
- They are pending adoption.
- They are too young for adoption.

MEET SHERWOOD!

On Saturday, we received a call from Animal Emergency and Referral Center of York, who we partner with to take stray animals who come to their facility, about an injured stray dog. After picking up the dog and transporting him to our shelter, our medical team took x-rays and found breaks in the left front and left hind legs. This poor guy's front left humerus was broken and his back left leg was dislocated at the hip due to a femoral fracture. He was immediately started on several pain medications.

Sherwood, as he would later be named, didn't seem to know he was injured so badly. Despite a limp and inability to put weight on his front left leg, Sherwood was all smiles and tail wags. He would have walked for an hour in the sunshine if we let him. We estimate him to be a 10-month-old Poodle, and we're certain that he's one incredibly resilient puppy.


Because we do not have the capability to perform complicated orthopedic surgeries at the shelter, we asked the wonderful team at Lititz Veterinary Clinic to step in. On April 12th, one of our incredible volunteers drove Sherwood to the clinic, where he underwent surgery. Right now, Sherwood is recovering from surgical repair of both fractures.

Sherwood has already gone through more than any 10-month-old pup should have to go through, but he will still require treatment and TLC as he recovers in our care. He is not yet available for adoption and we will not be accepting adoption applications on Sherwood until he has progressed further in his recovery.


MEET SUGAR!

CLINIC

The clinic is looking for help during the following times. We do ask the volunteers helping in the clinic commit to a weekly shift.
