Animals are typically categorized as unavailable for adoption for the following reasons:

- They are new to the shelter and undergoing medical procedures, health evaluations, behavioral evaluations, or need some time to decompress.
- They are undergoing a mandatory hold
- They are a <u>SafePet</u> animal seeking refuge in our shelter
- They are protective custody animal due to the result of an animal cruelty investigation. These dogs are technically not our dogs to adopt out. We are going through the legal system to have the current owner or the court to sign the pet over to us.
- They are pending adoption
- They are too young for adoption

CAT AND KITTEN FOSTERING

Have you ever considered Cat or Kitten Fostering?

You can help a long term resident cat by providing a break from the shelter, or by taking in a set of kittens who need to be cared for in a home before they are old enough to adopt out. When you are a foster, all supplies needed for care are included, not just for kittens.

Fostering helps socialize cats and allows the foster parent to see their true personalities which could not completely blossom in the shelter. Foster parents are then abele to provide us with valuable information and photos of the cats that help them find better homes faster.
