Animals are typically categorized as unavailable for adoption for the following reasons:

- They are new to the shelter and undergoing medical procedures, health evaluations, behavioral evaluations, or need some time to decompress.
- They are undergoing a mandatory hold
- They are a <u>SafePet</u> animal seeking refuge in our shelter
- They are protective custody animal due to the result of an animal cruelty investigation. These dogs are technically not our dogs to adopt out. We are going through the legal system to have the current owner or the court to sign the pet over to us.
- They are pending adoption
- They are too young for adoption

HIGH NEED FOR HELP IN THE CLINIC

Clinic-

- Registration (Tuesday 7am-9am):
 The clinic is looking for volunteers who would be interested in helping in the morning for the registration process.
- End of the Day Help
 (Mon, Thurs, and Fri 2pm-4pm):
 The clinic is looking for volunteers who can help with clean up and check-out at the end of the day. This will include scrubbing surgical instruments, bringing laundry to the laundry room, and cleaning the areas. You may also be helping with bringing animals out to their owners.

Satellite Sites-

- PetCo: We are looking for volunteers who can help consistently at this satellite site at the following times.
 - Morning Shift: Tuesday and Friday 1-2 hours between 9am-12pm
 - Mid-day Shift: Sun-Sat1-2 hours between 11am-3pm

ANIMALS UNAVAILABLE FOR ADOPTION

Please remember that not all of the animals at the shelter are available for adoption. On the first page of the newsletter we talk about all the different reasons why an animal could be unavailable for an adoption.

For these reasons, we need to be careful to not recommend an animals to the public, including friends or family, if they are not available yet.

We have had a few applications come in for unavailable animals. This is time spent explaining why the animals are unavailable, when the staff could be encouraging adoptions for those that are currently available.

We appreciate your support and understanding with this process.
